Rules of Implementation for

The the Bilateral Offset Credit Joint Crediting Mechanism (BOCMJCM)

The Joint Committee of the **BOCMJCM**, mentioned in "Low Carbon Growth Partnership between the Japanese side and the Bangladeshi side", hereby establishes the rules of implementation for the **BOCMJCM** as follows:

A. Purpose of the **BOCMJCM**

- 1. The **BOCMJCM** has the following purposes:
 - (a) To facilitate diffusion of leading low carbon technologies, products, systems, services, and infrastructure as well as implementation of mitigation actions, and contributing to sustainable development of the People's Republic of Bangladesh;
 - (b) To appropriately evaluate contributions to greenhouse gases (hereinafter referred to as "GHG") emission reductions or removals from Japan in a quantitative manner, through mitigation actions implemented in the People's Republic of Bangladesh and use those emission reductions or removals to achieve emission reduction targets of Japan;
 - (c) To contribute to the ultimate objective of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) by facilitating global actions for emission reductions or removals.

B. Scope

- 2. GHG are those gases of carbon dioxide (CO_2) , methane (CH_4) , nitrous oxide (N_2O) , hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), perfluorocarbons (PFCs), sulphur hexafluoride (SF_6) and nitrogen trifluoride (NF_3) as adopted by CMP8.
- 3. Credits are issued based on quantified amount of GHG emission reductions or removals achieved by the contribution of project participants in the implementation of GHG emission reductions or removals project activities under the BOCMJCM (hereinafter referred to as "BOCMJCM projects").
- 4. The **BOCMJCM** starts its operation as the non-tradable credit type mechanism. The Japanese side and the Bangladeshi side (hereinafter referred to as "both sides") continue

consultation for the transition to the tradable credit type mechanism and reach a conclusion at the earliest possible timing, taking account of implementation of the **BOCMJCM**.

C. Definitions

5. Terms in the Rules of Implementation for the **BOCM** are defined in the **BOCM JCM** Glossary of Terms.

D. Joint Committee

- 6. Both sides establish the Joint Committee which consists of the representatives from both sides.—
- 7. The Joint Committee may develop or modify the Rules of Implementation and other rules and guidelines necessary for the implementation of the **BOCMJCM**, including, but not limited to:
 - (a) rules of procedures of the Joint Committee;
 - (b) guidelines for the development of methodologies;
 - (c) methodologies;
 - (d) guidelines for the designation of as a third-party entityies;
 - (e) guidelines for the validation;
 - (f) monitoring guidelines;
 - (g) guidelines for the verification of GHG emission reductions or removals;
 - (h) common specifications for registries;
 - formatsforms for project design document (hereinafter referred to as "PDD"), request for registration of <u>BOCMJCM</u> projects, monitoring report, request for verification of emission reductions or removals, etc.
- 8. The Joint Committee designates the third-party entities.
- 9. On the basis of a request for registration of **BOCMJCM** projects submitted by project participants, the Joint Committee registers **BOCMJCM** projects which were validated by the third-party entities.
- 10. On the basis of a request for notification to each side for issuance of credits submitted by project participants, the Joint Committee notifies both sides to issue the credits which were

verified by the third-party entities.

- 11. The Joint Committee develops reports on the status of the implementation of the BOCMJCM and, where necessary, discusses issues related to the operation and management of the BOCMJCM.
- 12. In conjunction with meetings of the Joint Committee, both sides conduct policy consultations about the relevant policy measures of the BOCMJCM.
- 13. The Joint Committee establishes its secretariat for the implementation of the **BOCMJCM**.

E. Each Side

- 14. Each side, based on the rules and guidelines as developed by the Joint Committee and/or in accordance with relevant domestic laws and regulations in respective countries for the implementation of the BOCMJCM:
 - (a) Prepares draft methodologies and submits them to the Joint Committee;
 - (b) Establishes and maintains a registry in line with the common specifications for registries, as developed by the Joint Committee;
 - (c) On the basis of notification for issuance of credit by the Joint Committee (including for allocation of credits among participants), issues the notified amount of credits to its registry.
- 15. Each side promptly informs the Joint Committee on the issuance of credits under the **BOCMJCM**.
- 16. Each side takes necessary measures to ensure transparency in the implementation of the **BOCMJCM**.
- 17. Neither side uses any mitigation projects registered under the **BOCMJCM** for the purpose of any other international climate mitigation mechanisms to avoid double counting.

F. Third-party Entities

- 18. A third-party entity that is designated by the Joint Committee:
 - (a) On the basis of requests from project participants, validates the project as described in a PDD prepared by the project participants, in line with the guidelines for the validation as developed by the Joint Committee, and informs the validation result to the project participants;
 - (b) On the basis of requests from project participants, verifies GHG emission reductions or removals achieved by the <u>BOCMJCM</u> project as described in the monitoring report prepared by the project participants, in line with the guidelines for the verification of GHG emission reductions or removals as developed by the Joint Committee, records the verification result in a verification report and sends the report to the project participants.

G. Project Participants

19. Project participants:

- (a) Prepare a draft methodology and submit the draft to the Joint Committee for its approval;
- (b) Prepare a draft PDD and submit the draft to a third-party entity for validation and notify the Joint Committee;
- (c) Submit the PDD that was validated by the third-party entity to the Joint Committee for its registration of the project;
- (d) Implement the **BOCMJCM** project and conduct monitoring in line with the PDD-;
- (e) Prepare a monitoring report and send the report to a third-party entity for verification;
- (f) Submit a verification report prepared by the third-party entity to the Joint Committee, and request notification to each side for issuance of credits under the BOCMJCM.

H. Development of Methodologies

- 20. Each side or project participant prepares a draft methodology and submits it to the Joint Committee. The submitted draft methodology, after its completeness being checked, goes through public comments inputs process.
- 21. The Joint Committee determines either to approve or reject the draft methodology,

taking account of, among other things, <u>commentsinputs</u> received and notifies the result to each side or project participant, as applicable. The Joint Committee makes publicly available the relevant information on the approved methodologies through a website.

I. Designation of Third-party Entities

- 22. Upon receiving an application for designation <u>asof</u> a third-party entity submitted by a candidate, the Joint Committee designates a third-party entity in line with the guidelines for the designation <u>of as a third-party entity</u>; and makes publicly available the relevant information on the designated third-party entity through a website.
- 23. The Joint Committee may suspend or withdraw the designation of a third-party entity if it has found fraud, malfeasance or incompetence of the entity.

J. Validation

- 24. Validation is the process of independent evaluation of a proposed **BOCMJCM** project by a third-party entity against the validation guidelines as developed by the Joint Committee on the basis of the PDD.
- 25. Project participants develop a PDD by filling in the <u>formatform</u> and request a third-party entity to validate the proposed <u>BOCMJCM</u> project.
- 26. The third-party entity, in line with the guidelines for the validation as developed by the Joint Committee, validates the proposed **BOCMJCM** project as described in the PDD and notifies the result of the validation to the project participants.

K. Registration

- 27. Registration is the formal acceptance by the Joint Committee of a validated project as a **BOCMJCM** project.
- 28. Project participants submit the PDD, which was validated by the third-party entity, to the Joint Committee and request for registration.
- 29. Upon receiving the request for registration from project participants, the Joint

Committee registers the project, notifies each side of the registration and makes publicly available the relevant information on the **BOCMJCM** project through a website.

L. Monitoring

30. Project participants implement a **BOCMJCM** project and monitor GHG emission reductions or removals by the **BOCMJCM** project based on the PDD.

M. Verification

- 31. Verification is the periodic independent review and ex post determination by a third-party entity of the monitored GHG emissions reductions or removals as a result of a registered BOCMJCM project during the verification period.
- 32. Project participants prepare a monitoring report and request a third-party entity for verification.
- 33. The third-party entity, in line with the guidelines for the verification of GHG emission reductions or removals as developed by the Joint Committee, verifies the amount of GHG emission reductions or removals on the basis of the monitoring report submitted by the project participants, prepares a verification report and sends the report to the project participants which requested verification.

N. Issuance of Credits

- 34. Each side establishes a registry to record and use the credits.
- 35. Project participants of a <u>JCMBOCM</u> project consult among themselves, and determine, the allocation of credits <u>taking into consideration their contribution to GHG emission reductions</u> or removals.
- The project participants may allocate part of the credits to the respective sides.
- 36.37. Project participants request the Joint Committee to notify each side to issue the credits to its respective account in the registry on the basis of the verification report with the

determined allocation of the credits among the project participants.

37.38. The Joint Committee conducts a completeness check on the request, including for allocation of the credits among the project participants, and notifies each side of the result.

38.39. The Joint Committee makes publicly available the relevant information on the issuance of credits through a website.

O. Use of Credits

39.40. Credits issued by the Japanese side can be used to achieve its emission reduction target. Credits issued by the Bangladeshi side can be used for its own mitigation contribution, including nationally appropriate mitigation actions.

40.41. Each side checks the status of the issuance and use of credits and makes sure that no double counting as described in paragraph 16 of credits is discovered.

P. Others

41.42. A project which started operation on or after 1 January 2013 is eligible for consideration as the BOCMJCM project.

42. The BOCMJCM covers the period from the date "Low Carbon Growth Partnership between the Japanese side and the Bangladeshi side" is signed until a possible coming into effect of a new international framework under the UNFCCC. Both sides consider possible extension of the BOCMJCM and reach a conclusion before its termination, taking into account, inter alia, the progress made in the United Nations negotiations on climate change.

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
