Joint Crediting Mechanism Guidelines for Designation of a Third-Party Entity

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1. Objectives

- 1. The objectives of the "Joint Crediting Mechanism Guidelines for designation as a Third-Party Entity" (hereinafter referred to as "these Guidelines") are as follows:
 - (a) To establish the criteria and procedures for designation of third-party entities (hereinafter referred to as the "TPEs"), to perform validation and verification activities under the Joint Crediting Mechanism (hereinafter referred to as "JCM"); and
 - (b) To establish the criteria and procedures for suspension and withdrawal of designation of a-TPEs.

2. Scope and applicability

- 2. These Guidelines are applicable to candidate entities, TPEs, the Joint Committee and the JCM secretariat (hereinafter referred to as "the secretariat") with respect to designation, suspension and withdrawal of TPEs.
- 3. These Guidelines describe standards which are requirements to be met, except guidance indicated with terms "should" and "may" as defined in paragraph 7 below.

3. Normative references

- 4. The following referenced documents are indispensable for the application of these Guidelines:
 - (a) ISO 14065:2007 Greenhouse gases Requirements for greenhouse gas validation and verification bodies for use in accreditation or other forms of recognition; and
 - (b) Clean Development Mechanism Accreditation Standard for Operational Entities.

4. Terms and definitions

- TPEs are entities designated by the Joint Committee as qualified to validate proposed JCM
 projects as well asand/or verify GHG emission reductions or removals as a result of
 registered JCM projects.
- 6. Candidate entities are entities which have applied to be designated by the Joint Committee as TPEs.
- 7. The following terms apply in these Guidelines:
 - (a) "Should" is used to indicate that among several possibilities, one course of action is recommended as particularly suitable; and
 - (b) "May" is used to indicate what is permitted.
- 8. Terms in these Guidelines are defined in JCM Glossary of Terms available on the JCM website.

5. Designation as a TPE

4.1.5.1. Requirements for designation as a TPE

9. To be designated as <u>a TPEs</u>, <u>a candidate entities entity</u> fulfills all requirements as listed paragraphs 10 toand 11 below.

4.2. General

- 10. To be eligible to become a TPE under the JCM, the candidate <u>Candidate entity entities</u> is are either:
 - (a) An entityEntities accredited under ISO 14065 by an accreditation body that is a member of the International Accreditation Forum (hereinafter referred to as "IAF") based on ISO 14064-2; or
 - (b) A-Designated Operational Entity Entities (hereinafter referred to as "DOEs") or operational entities accredited by the Executive Board under of the Clean Development Mechanism (hereinafter referred to as "CDM")-.
- 11. Candidate entities are designated to perform JCM validation or verification activities for which they are accredited or designated in line with paragraph 10, for the sectoral scopes determined by the Joint Committee in line with paragraph 12. The sectoral scopes for the JCM are based on those of the CDM, and are listed in Annex 1.
- 12. The sectoral scopes eligible for the candidate entities are determined as follows:
 - (a) Candidate entities which are accredited under ISO 14065 are eligible for the sectoral scopes as determined by the Joint Committee taking into consideration their sectoral competence as described in their application.
 - (b) Candidate entities which are DOEs are eligible for the sectoral scopes for which they are designated as DOEs.

4.3. Competence

13.11. A TPECandidate entities has have sufficient knowledge of the JCM between the Republic of Indonesia and Japan by reading and knowing all applicable rules and guidelines of the JCM.

4.4.5.2. Procedures for designation as a TPE

- 12. Sectoral scopes under the JCM are described in Annex 1.
- 14.13. A Candidate candidate entities entity submits an the application form as shown in Annex 2 in these Guidelines to the Joint Committee through the secretariat. The application form is as shown in Annex 2.
 - (a) The candidate entity clearly indicates all sectoral scopes it wishes to be designated in the application form.

- 15.14. When a TPE wishes to be designated under the JCM for additional sectoral scopes—in line with paragraph 12, the TPE submits an-the application form and seeks its designation for those sectoral scopes.
- 16.15. The secretariat checks whether the application form is complete, and communicates the result to the candidate entity within seven (7) days after the receipt of the submission.
- <u>17.16.</u> When the application <u>has been completed is deemed complete</u>, the Joint Committee <u>determines decides</u> whether to designate the candidate entity as a TPE or reject the application.
- 17. When the Joint Committee designates the candidate entity, applicable sectoral scopes under the JCM for such entity are decided on the basis of:
 - (a) In case the candidate entities are accredited under ISO 14065, sectoral competence of the candidate entities as described in their application; and
 - (b) In case the candidate entities are designated/accredited under the CDM, the sectoral scopes identical to those under the CDM unless otherwise decided by the Joint Committee.
- 18. The secretariat notifies the result of the above decision to the candidate entity and makes the relevant information of the designated TPE and the sectoral scopes publicly available through the JCM website.
- 19. When the TPE changes its contact details, the TPE notifies the secretariat of such changes by electronic means immediately.

5.6. Suspension or withdrawal of the designation as a TPE 1

5.1.6.1. Conditions for suspension or withdrawal of designation as TPE

- <u>19.20.</u> The <u>Joint Committee may suspend or withdraw the designation of a TPE is suspended or withdrawn under the following conditions:</u>
 - (a) When the <u>Joint Committee decides that performance of the TPE no longer complies</u>
 <u>with under the applicable JCM rules and guidelines following is found to be not appropriate by the review conducted by the Joint Committee.</u>
 - (b) When the status of the TPE changes regarding accreditation under ISO 14065 and/or accreditation/designation under the CDMhas ceased to meet the conditions described in paragraph 10; and
 - (b)(c) When the TPE voluntarily withdraws its designation status under the JCM.
- 20. When the Joint Committee suspends the designation of a TPE, the Joint Committee decides on whether to totally or partially suspend the TPE.

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Suspension or withdrawal of the designation may be for some or all sectoral scopes.

5.2.6.2. Procedures for suspension or withdrawal

5.2.1.6.2.1. Procedures for suspension or withdrawal following a review

- 21. The Joint Committee may conduct a review on whether a TPE continues to comply with the applicable JCM rules and guidelines. Such review may include on-site visits to evaluate the performance of a TPE. The Joint Committee may ask-decide to appoint external experts or organizations—to—conduct such activities which assist part of its work regarding the review.
- 22. If the Joint Committee has carried out a review and found that the TPE no longer complies with the applicable JCM rules and guidelines, the Joint Committee <u>decides on whether tomay</u> suspend or withdraw the designation of the TPE <u>for some or all sectoral scopes</u>, but only after the TPE has had the possibility of a hearing. The suspension <u>and or withdrawal takes</u> immediately <u>commences</u> <u>effect after on the date when</u> the decision <u>is taken</u> by the Joint Committee.

5.2.2.6.2.2. Procedures for suspension or withdrawal due to ceasing to meet the conditions described in paragraph 10changes in the status of the TPE regarding accreditation under ISO 14065 and/or accreditation/designation under the CDM

- 23. For a TPE accredited only under ISO 14065, when its accreditation under ISO 14065 is suspended or withdrawn, the designation of the TPE for some or all sectoral scopes², the designation of the TPE for the corresponding sectoral scopes under the JCM is suspended or withdrawn on the date such suspension or withdrawal commences with immediate effect.
- 24. For a TPE designated only under the CDM, when the <u>accreditation/designation</u> is suspended or withdrawn <u>for some or all sectoral scopes</u>, the designation of the TPE for the <u>corresponding sectoral scopes under the JCM</u> is suspended or withdrawn <u>on the date such</u> suspension or withdrawal commences <u>with immediate effect</u>.
- 25. For a TPE accredited <u>under ISO14065 or and</u> designated <u>both under ISO14065 and the CDM:</u>
 - (a) When either the accreditation under ISO 14065 or accreditation/designation under the CDM for either programme is suspended or withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes, the designation of the TPE for the corresponding sectoral scopes under the JCM is suspended or withdrawn on the date such suspension or withdrawal commences with immediate effect except for unless otherwise the cases described in subparagraphs (b) and (c) below;
 - (b) When either the TPE voluntarily withdraws the accreditation for some or all sectoral

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² "Withdrawal for some sectoral scopes" is described as "reducing scopes" under ISO 14065.

- scopes under ISO 14065 or the TPE voluntarily withdraws the designation accreditation for some or all sectoral scopes under the CDM, for either programme without having been being suspended, the TPE maintains its designation of the TPE under the JCM is maintained for the corresponding sectoral scopes for which the TPE continues its accreditation or designation under the other programme; or and
- (c) When either the TPE voluntarily withdraws the accreditation for some or all sectoral scopes under ISO 14065 or the TPE voluntarily withdraws the accreditation for some or all sectoral scopes under the CDM, designation for either programme is voluntarily withdrawn following itswhich is currently under suspension, the designation of the TPE for the corresponding sectoral scopes under the JCM is suspended until the Joint Committee decides whether to withdraw or reinstate the on withdrawal or continued designation of such TPE.
- 26. In case when the status of the TPE falls under the conditions described in paragraphs 2322 to 2524 above, the TPE notifies the Joint Committee through the secretariat of such suspension or withdrawal status without delay.

6.2.3. Procedures for voluntary withdrawal by a TPE

- 27. A TPE may withdraw its designation status for some or all sectoral scopes by submitting the letter through electric means specified on the JCM website, to the Joint Committee indicating the following:
 - (a) Name of the TPE with the signature of its authorized representative;
 - (b) Sectoral scopes that the TPE wishes to withdraw; and
 - (c) Date when the TPE wishes to withdraw its designation.
- 28. Voluntary withdrawal of the designation by a TPE for some or all sectoral scopes is effective on the same date indicated in line with paragraph 27(c) above.
- 29. Voluntary withdrawal of the designation by a TPE does not free the TPE from its contractual arrangement, including costs related to assessment conducted before withdrawal of designation of the TPE.

5.3.6.3. Procedures following suspension or withdrawal

- 27.30. When the Joint Committee decides to suspend or withdraw the designation of a TPE is suspended or withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes, the secretariat makes the name of the suspended or withdrawn TPE, its status regarding sectoral scopes suspended or withdrawn and the reasons for its-the suspension or withdrawal publicly available through the JCM website without delay.
- 28.31. When the designation of a TPE is suspended or withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes, the TPE notifies all affected organizations including project participants which the

- TPE is under contract to perform JCM validation and/or verification activities at-by the time of suspension or withdrawal.
- 29.32. When the designation of a TPE is suspended, the TPE may continue its ongoing JCM validation and/or verification activities for which the contract was in force at the time of its suspension.
- 30.33. When the designation of a TPE has been is withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes, the TPE does not continue any JCM validation and/or verification activities for the sectoral scopes withdrawn.
- <u>affected by its suspension or withdrawal</u>, are not affected by the suspension or withdrawal of the TPE. Hhowever, the Joint Committee may conduct any actions to these projects.

5.4. Voluntary withdrawal of a TPE

- 32. A TPE may withdraw its application for designation or its designation status by submitting a request to the Joint Committee through the secretariat.
- 33. The TPE informs, if applicable, any affected organizations of the withdrawal of its application for designation or its designation status.
- 34. Voluntary withdrawal of designation by a TPE does not free the TPE from its contractual arrangement with its clients or with the secretariat, including costs related to assessment conducted before withdrawal of designation of the TPE.
- 35. When a TPE has withdrawn, the TPE does not continue any JCM validation and/or verification activities.

5.5.6.4. Procedures for reinstatement of designation for suspended or withdrawn TPE

- 36. The procedure for reinstatement for suspended TPE is as follows.
- 37.35. When a TPE whose designation is suspended or withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes in line with paragraph 20(a) above suspended following the review of the Joint Committee wishes its designation to be reinstated under the JCM, the TPE submits an the application form and documents which explain corrective actions for the causes of its suspension. The Joint Committee decides whether to reinstate the TPE based on the submitted documents.
- 36. When a TPE whose designation is suspended or withdrawn for some or all sectoral scopes in line with paragraph 20(b) above since it ceased to meet the conditions described in paragraph 10 has once again met the conditions, the TPE wishing wishes its designation to be reinstated under the JCM after the suspension is lifted or the accreditation is reinstated under ISO 14065 and/or the CDM, the TPE submits an-the application form.

- 37. When a TPE whose designation is voluntarily withdrawn in line with paragraph 20(c) above wishes its designation to be reinstated, the entity submits the application form.
- 38. –The Joint Committee decides <u>on</u> whether to reinstate the <u>designation of the suspended or</u> <u>withdrawn TPE based on the submitted documents</u>.
- 39. When the designation a suspension of a TPE is reinstated removed, the secretariat makes the name of the reinstated TPE and its reinstated sectoral scopes publicly available through the JCM website without delay.
- 40. A TPE which has been withdrawn may re apply in line with the procedure described in paragraphs 14 to 16.

7. Provisional designation

7.1. General

40. The number of provisional designations per year does not exceed two (2) from Indonesian entities and two (2) from Japanese entities.

7.2. Requirements for provisional designation as a TPE

- 41. The Joint Committee may provisionally designate an entity from Indonesia or Japan as a TPE for some or all sectoral scopes for which the entity is not designated within two (2) years from the date when this section of these Guidelines is adopted, if a candidate entity fulfills the conditions as follows:
 - (a) The entity has made a formal application for the accreditation under ISO 14065 based on ISO 14064-2 to an accreditation body that is a member of the IAF; and
 - (b) The accreditation body has completed the document and record review and the on-site assessment at the premise of the entity in the accreditation process stipulated in ISO/IEC 17011: 2004.

7.3. Procedures for provisional designation as a TPE

- 42. The procedures for provisional designation are the same as the procedures described in section 5.2 above except for paragraph 17. When the candidate entity submits the application form to the Joint Committee though the secretariat, the candidate entity:
 - (a) Informs the date on which the application for accreditation was received by the accreditation body; and
 - (b) Attaches documents which demonstrate that the entity meets the condition described in paragraph 41 above including information on the sectoral scopes for which the candidate entity made a formal application for the accreditation under ISO 14065.
- 43. When the Joint Committee provisionally designates the candidate entity, applicable sectoral scopes under the JCM for such entity are decided on the basis of sectoral competence of the

- candidate entities as described in their application.
- 44. The term for which an entity is provisionally designated as a TPE is at a maximum of two

 (2) years from the date when the application form for the accreditation under ISO 14065

 was received by the accreditation body.
- 45. The Joint Committee withdraws the provisional designation of a TPE if:
 - (a) The accreditation body decides not to proceed with the further accreditation process;
 - (b) The accreditation body decides not to grant accreditation to the entity;
 - (c) The accreditation body does not decide to grant accreditation to the entity within two (2) years from the date when the application form for the accreditation under ISO 14065 was received by the accreditation body; or
 - (d) The provisionally designated TPE voluntarily withdraws the formal application for the accreditation under ISO 14065.
- 46. The conditions and procedures for suspension, withdrawal and reinstatement of the provisional designation other than those described in paragraph 45 above are the same as the conditions and procedures described in section 6 above except for the cases described in paragraph 20(b), section 6.2.2 and paragraph 36.
- 47. In case the status of the provisionally designated TPE falls under the conditions described in paragraph 45 above, the provisionally designated TPE notifies the Joint Committee through the secretariat of such status without delay.
- 48. Once the provisionally designated TPE is accredited under ISO 14065, the entity notifies the accreditation and its accredited scope(s) to the secretariat without delay. The provisionally designated TPE is designated as a TPE based on its accredited scope(s) under ISO 14065 on the date when the entity notifies the accreditation to the secretariat.
- 49. Once the provisionally designated TPE is designated as a TPE, the results of validation and/or verification commenced under the capacity of the provisionally designated TPE and witnessed by the accreditation body become valid automatically based on the designated sectoral scope(s).

6.8. Others

41.50. The TPE to conduct validation/verification of JCM projects in Indonesia should include Indonesian personnel as their team members.
